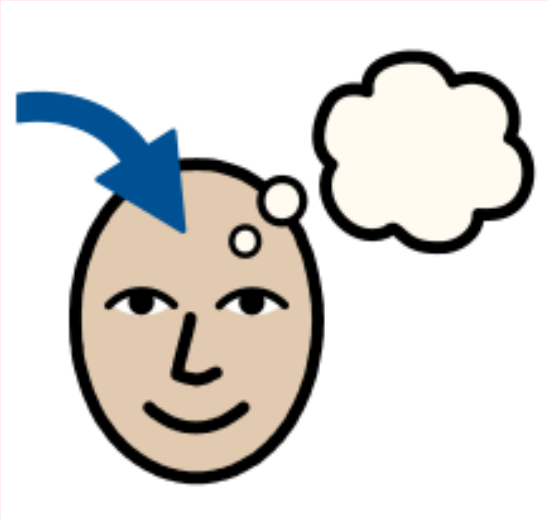

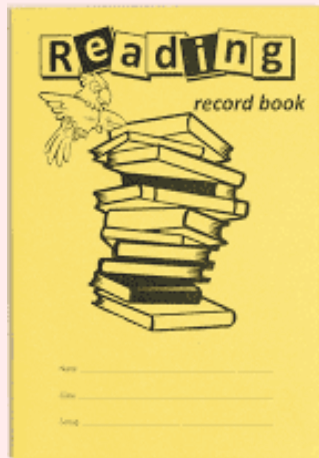
Reading

Reading at Home



- Ideally, 5 or more minutes a day, every day
- Try to build this into your daily routine
- Have a quiet, comfortable space your child (and you) can read in
- Read with your child and read in front of your child
- Remember, both reading and hearing texts read aloud are important!
